NOTICE OF FILING OF PROPOSED RATE INCREASE AND PUBLIC HEARING

TO OUR CUSTOMERS:

Notice is hereby given that on January 9, 2015, New Jersey-American Water Company, Inc., (the "Company") filed with the Board of Public Utilities ("Board"), pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-18, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21.1, N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.7and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12, a petition ("Petition") seeking to increase rates for water and wastewater service and to change its depreciation rates and to implement other tariff revisions. These changes were proposed to become effective for service rendered on or after February 8, 2015, or at such later date as may be determined by the Board. Based on the Company's total projected operating revenues for the twelve months ending July 31, 2015, the new rates proposed herein will yield additional operating revenues of \$66.2 million or 9.96%. The total projected operating revenues include the revenue currently being recovered through the Distribution System Improvement Charge ("DSIC") previously approved by this Board, and revenues recovered through the PWAC/PSTAC.

The actual percentage increase to specific customers will vary according to the applicable rate schedule and the level of the customer's usage. The rate changes proposed in the Petition will result in a rate increase for a typical residential customer with a 5/8-inch meter using 6,000 gallons of water per month of \$5.16 or 9.89%. The typical commercial customer with a 1-inch meter using 20,000 gallons of water per month would receive an increase of \$14.92 or 9.19%.

The following comparisons of average present and proposed rates will permit customers to determine the approximate net effect upon them of the proposed increases and adjustments in rates. Any assistance required by customers in this regard will be furnished by the Company

upon request. Complete information about the present and proposed rates for every class of customer is available on the Company's website at www.newjerseyamwater.com by first selecting Customer Service and then Rates Information. Please note that the Board, in its discretion, may apply all or any portion of whatever rate increase the Board may ultimately find just and reasonable to any class or classes of customers or to any rate schedule or schedules, or in a manner different than what the Company has proposed in its filing. Accordingly, the final rates and charges to be determined by the Board in this proceeding may be different than what the Company has described herein. General Metered Service or "GMS" rate information is presented as a range of rates. The range includes both a fixed service charge and a consumption charge based on an average of 6,000 gallons per month.

BY THE BOARD1:

On January 9, 2015, New Jersey-American Water Company ("Company" or "Petitioner"), a public utility of the State of New Jersey subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities ("Board"), filed a Petition pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-18, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, N.J.S.A. 48:2-21.1², N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.7 and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12 seeking to increase rates for water and wastewater service. The combined proposed rates would increase the Company's annual revenues by \$66.2 million or approximately 9.96% over pro-forma present rate revenues. Petitioner serves approximately 612,791 water and fire service customers, and approximately 35,987 sewer service customers, in all or part of 189 municipalities in 18 of the State's 21 counties. The increase in rates would become effective on February 8, 2015³. Petitioner does not seek interim rate relief pending final determination on the Petition.

According to the Petition, the rate increase is necessary: (a) for the Company: to finance essential and continuing plant investment; (b) earn a fair and adequate rate of return on its net investment in used and useful property; (c) establish rates which are sufficient, under efficient and economical operation, to maintain and support its financial integrity, and to raise such funds as may be necessary for the proper discharge of its public duties; (d) provide earnings sufficient

to attract investors and fund the Company's operations; and (e) enable the Company to continue to provide safe, adequate and proper service to its customers.

It appearing that the proposed revisions will increase existing rates and change or after existing classifications in Petitioner's tariff, it is **HEREBY ORDERED** that:

- (1) Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 48:2-21, the proposed revisions be, and are, suspended until June 8, 2015, unless the Board, prior to that date, makes a determination disposing of the petition, or enters an Order further suspending the proposed revisions;
- (2) Petitioner shall, at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for hearing on the petition by the Office of Administrative Law, file with the Board and with the Office of Administrative Law (33 Washington Street, Newark N.J. 07102), proof of compliance with the Notice provisions of N.J.S.A 48:2-32.2 and N.J.A.C. 14:1-5.12 (b) and (c), which Notice shall include a statement that any relief found by the Board to be just and reasonable may be allocated by the Board to any class or classes of customers on any rate or schedule as the Board may determine; and
- (3) Petitioner shall serve copies of this Order upon the Office of Administrative Law, Division of Rate Counsel (140 East Front Street, 4th Floor, Post Office Box 003, Trenton, NJ 08625-0003), the clerk of each affected municipality, the clerk of the Boards of Chosen Freeholders of each affected county and, where appropriate, the executive officer of each affected county within its service area. Service of the petition, notice of hearings and this Order may be made simultaneously. Proof of service of this Order shall be filed with the Board within fifteen (15) days of the date of this Order.

This Order shall be effective on February 23, 2015.
