Secretary Camacho-Welch:

Sunrun Inc. ("Sunrun") is in receipt of the September 24, 2019 letter from Public Service Electric and Gas Company ("PSE&G") in response to the September 13, 2019 letter from Sunrun ("Sunrun Letter"). The Sunrun Letter requested the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") exercise its discretion and allow Sunrun to participate in any future discussions and potential final resolutions or additional, interim agreements regarding PSE&G's Clean Energy Future – Energy Efficiency Petition ("CEF-EE Petition").

PSE&G states in its response that it does not object to Sunrun's participation in future settlement discussions subject to certain conditions, including that "all participants to this proceeding must be offered the same opportunity to attend the settlement conferences" and "the ability to execute a future stipulation must continue to be reserved for parties to this proceeding, and not participants." Sunrun agrees that all participants should be provided the opportunity to participate in future settlement negotiations regarding the CEF-EE Petition. However, Sunrun disagrees with PSE&G's proposed condition that participants be excluded from executing a future stipulation to the extent that this condition would apply to Sunrun.

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Sunrun is the only participant in this proceeding for which party status was denied despite findings that Sunrun has a "significant interest in the outcome of this proceeding that is different from that of other parties" and that Sunrun's specific perspective "could add to the development of the record in this proceeding." Given that this proceeding has been extended by 250 days beyond the statutory 180-day period for Board action, the reasons for denying Sunrun party status – "the need to meet [the Board's] statutory obligations in a timely manner" and "the need for prompt and expeditious administrative proceedings" – no longer apply. As such, the interests of justice and fairness favor not only providing Sunrun the opportunity to participate in future settlement discussions, but allowing Sunrun to be a party to potential final resolutions or additional, interim agreements in this proceeding.

Sunrun respectfully requests the Board take these circumstances into consideration and grant the relief requested in the Sunrun Letter and herein, and such other relief as the Board determines appropriate.
