TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

- 1. Petitioner, Aqua New Jersey, Inc. (hereinafter "Petitioner" or the "Company"), a public utility of the State of New Jersey, with its principal business office at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691, hereby petitions for approval to set prospective purchased wastewater treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") rates for calendar year 2024 pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 et seq.
- 2. Petitioner's Wallkill Sewer Division ("Wallkill"), formerly the Wallkill Sewer Company, provides wastewater service to approximately 447 customers in a portion of the Township of Hardyston, County of Sussex, pursuant to an Order of the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board").
- 3. Wallkill purchases wastewater treatment services from the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority ("SCMUA"). SCMUA treats all of the wastewater collected by Wallkill pursuant to the "1982 Wallkill Sewer Company Service Contract" (as amended May 3, 1984) between the Company and SCMUA. In December¹ of each year, SCMUA estimates the

annual cost of wastewater to be treated for Wallkill and bills the Company in four equal installments based on that estimate.² To the extent that any credits are due the Company, or additional payments are due SCMUA (based on actual usage during the year), those amounts are included in the estimate of costs for the upcoming fiscal year and reflected in the February payment.

- 4. Petitioner's Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim") provides wastewater service to approximately 2,617 customers in the Township of Howell, County of Monmouth, pursuant to a municipal consent and franchise, and an Order of the Board approving the franchise and accepting Petitioner's initial tariff for filing.
- 5. Maxim purchases wastewater treatment services from the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). The OCUA treats all of the wastewater collected by Maxim, which is a Bulk Rate customer of the OCUA. Bills are rendered by the OCUA and paid by Maxim on a quarterly basis during the year. In January of each year, the OCUA (i) estimates the annual volume of wastewater to be treated for Maxim and bills the Company quarterly thereafter based on that estimate, and (ii) reconciles the actual volumes treated for Maxim in the prior calendar year and provides a charge or a credit, depending on Maxim's actual usage, on Maxim's first quarter bill in the following year.
- 6. Petitioner also purchases wastewater treatment services from the Logan Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("LTMUA"). LTMUA treats all of the wastewater collected by the Company in its Woolwich service territory pursuant to the Sewer Service Agreement dated

Bills are rendered by SCMUA and paid by Wallkill four times during the year (February, May, August and November).

September 14, 2000 (as amended April 28, 2015) between the Company and LTMUA.³ LTMUA bills the Company a fixed monthly amount for each Equivalent Dwelling Unit ("EDU"),⁴ which is determined by the LTMUA rate schedule in effect. There are approximately 2,985 EDUs for which the LTMUA provides treatment.

7. Prior to January 1, 2021, the Company's rate schedules included a separate PSTAC for Wallkill⁵ and Maxim⁶ customers, and the treatment costs for LTMUA were included in the fixed monthly service charge to customers serviced by the Woolwich, California Village, Hanover Village and Spartan Village systems. However, in connection with the Company's 2020 Wastewater Base Rate Case, BPU Docket No. WR20010056, the Board approved the Company's request to establish a uniform PSTAC to include all of its purchased water treatment costs and to charge those costs to all customers, which uniform rate was effective January 1, 2021.⁷ Then, in connection with the Company's 2021 PSTAC filing, the Board approved the Company's uniform PSTAC rate⁸ for all customers effective January 1, 2022. Those rates are set forth in the

Company's currently effective tariff at Rate Schedule No. 2.9

8. The total number of Petitioner's customers for whom treatment services are procured through SCMUA, OCUA and LTMUA is approximately 6,049. The costs of treatment will be spread across the Company's approximately 6,725 wastewater customers.

PSTAC RECONCILIATION FOR 2021 & 2022

- 9. Petitioner's 2022 PSTAC rate was held constant through 2023 and the true-up for costs from 2021 was deferred to this filing, because the Company's required PSTAC rate increase was minimal. Thus, with the consent of BPU Staff and the Division of Rate Counsel, the Company did not seek an increase in the PSTAC rate in 2023 and deferred the filing of its true-up of 2021 PSTAC rates in order to reduce expenses/customer costs and to preserve administrative resources.¹⁰
 - 10. Therefore, the effective 2023 PSTAC rates are those set forth in Exhibit B.
- 11. A true up of the PSTAC rates the Company was authorized to collect in 2021 and 2022 is set forth below.

2024 TREATMENT COSTS & 2024 PSTAC RATE

12. The Uniform 2022 PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in the 2021 Uniform PSTAC Order, which is attached as Exhibit A. Attached hereto as Exhibit B is the Company's

existing 2022 PSTAC tariff (*i.e.*, Rate Schedule No. 2). A proposed 2024 PSTAC tariff which reflects the proposed prospective rates for 2024 is attached hereto as Exhibit D.

- 13. Attached hereto as <u>Exhibit E</u> is a schedule which supports the proposed 2024 PSTAC tariff. As discussed above, the Company's 2024 PSTAC must set prospective rates for 2024 to address estimated treatment costs.
- 14. Petitioner has performed an analysis of the projected PSTAC costs for calendar year 2024, and estimated 2024 treatment costs to be: (i) \$206,001 for SCMUA; (ii) \$968,200 for OCUA; and \$1,286,905 for LTMUA. See Exhibit E (page 1). Additionally, as summarized on Exhibit E (page 2), the Company has estimated the cost of this proceeding to be \$8,000 and has included half of that amount, \$4,000 in its request in this proceeding. As indicated on Exhibit E (page 4), the Company has estimated that its total PSTAC revenue requirement for 2024 is \$2,381,933.
- Uniform PSTAC Order (and subsequent 2022 BPU Deferral Filing) and 2023 PSTAC revenues are estimated to be approximately \$2,399,917. When the 2023 PSTAC revenue requirement is compared to the level of PSTAC revenues estimated for 2024, there is excess revenue of \$17,984 (calculated on Exhibit E, page 4). As summarized on Exhibit E (page 6), the Company has developed a 2024 PSTAC rate to recover a total of \$2,381,933 in 2024 PSTAC revenues. As illustrated on Exhibit E (page 5), the decrease in the 2024 revenue requirement of \$17,679 (when compared to current rates) results in an across-the-board decrease in the present PSTAC rate of approximately 0.75% or approximately \$0.19 per 1,000 gallons.
 - 16. Petitioner reserves the right to amend this Petition and exhibits as necessary.

17. In light of the fact that Petitioner is seeking a rate <u>decrease</u>, which alleviates the need for a public comment hearing and related notices, Petitioner respectfully requests that the Board retain, and appoint a Commissioner to preside over, this matter in lieu of transferring it to the Office of Administrative Law. This will serve to expedite the matter and enable administrative efficiencies and preservation of resources for all parties.



BACKGROUND/PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On August 10, 2021, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to 7.7, Aqua New Jersey, Inc. ("Aqua," "Petitioner," or "Company") filed a petition with the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board") to set prospective Purchase Sewer Treatment Adjustment Clause ("PSTAC") rates for calendar year 2022 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d)(2) and 14:9-7.7.6.

Aqua represents it will true-up 2021 PSTAC revenues and rates in its 2022 PSTAC filing, and commits to making the 2022 PSTAC filing on a timely basis.

Petitioner's Wallkill Sewer Division ("Wallkill"), formerly the Wallkill Sewer Company, provides wastewater service to approximately 423 customers in a portion of the Township of Hardyston, County of Sussex, pursuant to an Order of the Board. Wallkill transmits the wastewater it collects to the Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority ("SCMUA") for treatment.

Petitioner's Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim") provides wastewater service to approximately 2,590 customers in the Township of Howell, County of Monmouth, pursuant to a municipal consent and franchise, and an Order of the Board approving the franchise and accepting

Petitioner's initial tariff for filing.² Maxim transits the wastewater it collects to the Ocean County Municipal Utilities Authority ("OCMUA").

Petitioner also purchases wastewater treatment services from the Logan Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("LTMUA"). LTMUA treats all of the wastewater collected by the Company in its Woolwich service territory pursuant to the Sewer Service Agreement dated September 14, 2000 (as amended April 28, 2015) between the Company and LTMUA. LTMUA bills the Company a fixed monthly amount for each Equivalent Dwelling Unit ("EDU"), which is determined by the LTMUA rate schedule in effect. There are approximately 2,959 EDUs for which the LTMUA provides treatment.

Aqua's last water base rate case concluded in May 2019.³ Aqua's last wastewater base rate case concluded in December 2020 and implemented a uniform fixed monthly PSTAC for all wastewater customers.⁴

The matter was retained by the Board for review and disposition. The Company, the New Jersey Division of Rate Counsel Rate Counsel, and Board Staff (collectively, "Parties") agreed that a public comment hearing was not required because the Petitioner had proposed a decrease in rates.

STIPULATION OF SETTLMENT

Following settlement negotiations, the Parties executed a Stipulation of Settlement ("Stipulation")⁵, which resolved all of the issues in the proceeding. The Stipulation is summarized below:

9. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined the Company's projected wastewater treatment expenses for 2022, as well as the costs of this proceeding. The Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should remain the same for 2022. In its petition, the Company determined that the current PSTAC rate should be decreased to recover \$28,697 less in revenues. The \$28,697 PSTAC decrease was calculated based on the following components:

a. Projected Sussex County Municipal Utilities Authority ("SCMUA") charges for 2022 of \$144,891 based on SCMUA rates effective for 2021;

- b. Projected Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA") charges for 2022 of \$949,165 based on OCUA rates effective for 2021;
- c. Projected LTMUA charges for 2022 of \$1,154,544 based on LTMUA rates effective for 2021;
- d. Projected rate case expenses of \$6,250. These costs will be share shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$3,125; and
- e. The pro forma PSTAC revenues at present rates are projected to be \$2,280,422.
- 10. After the petition was filed and during the discovery period, Aqua received a notice from SCMUA indicating that the treatment rate would be increased from \$144,891 to \$166,531 for 2022. With this increase to expense, the previously calculated decrease went from \$28,697 to \$7,057. Consequently, the proposed rate decrease went from -1.26% to -0.31%.
- 11. In addition, the Parties believe it reasonably likely that OCUA may also increase the Company's treatment costs for 2022, which increase will not be captured in rates for 2022.
- 12. The Stipulation therefore agrees that Petitioner's current PSTAC rate should remain unchanged.

As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Company has included in its filing an estimate of treatment costs for calendar year 2022, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2022.

DISCUSSION AND FINDING

Having reviewed the record in this matter, as well as the Stipulation, the Board <u>HEREBY FINDS</u> that the Stipulation is reasonable, in the public interest and is in accordance with the law. Therefore, the Board <u>HEREBY ADOPTS</u> the Stipulation attached hereto, including all attachments and schedules, as its own, incorporating by reference the terms and conditions of the Stipulation, as if fully set forth at length herein, subject to the following:

In accordance with the provisions of <u>N.J.A.C.</u> 14:9-7.3(c), the Petitioner shall file with the Board, no later than 45 days after the adjustment clause has been in effect for one year, or by December 31, 2022, whichever is earlier, a PSTAC true-up filing in connection with this proceeding. This filing shall include estimates of the OCUA, SCMUA, and LTMUA costs for calendar year 2022. Copies of the true-up filing shall be served upon all Parties to the present proceeding.

The Board <u>HEREBY DIRECTS</u> the Company to file tariff pages conforming to the terms and conditions of the Stipulation and this Order by January 1, 2022.

TO THE HONORABLE NEW JERSEY BOARD OF PUBLIC UTILITIES:

The Parties that have participated in this proceeding are Aqua New Jersey, Inc. ("Aqua," "Company," or "Petitioner"), the Division of Rate Counsel ("Rate Counsel"), and the Staff of the Board of Public Utilities ("Staff") (collectively, the "Parties"). There were no intervenors in this proceeding. As a result of an analysis of Aqua's Petition and exhibits, discovery conducted by Rate Counsel and Staff, conferences, and negotiations, the Parties to this proceeding have come to the within agreement. The Parties hereto agree and stipulate as follows:

1. Petitioner is a public utility of the State of New Jersey, with its principal business office at 10 Black Forest Road, Hamilton, New Jersey 08691, subject to the jurisdiction of the Board of Public Utilities (the "Board").

- 2. Petitioner's Wallkill Sewer Division ("Wallkill"), formerly the Wallkill Sewer Company, provides wastewater service to approximately 423 customers in a portion of the Township of Hardyston, County of Sussex, pursuant to an Order of the Board.
- 3. Petitioner's Maxim Wastewater Division ("Maxim") provides wastewater service to approximately 2,590 customers in the Township of Howell, County of Monmouth, pursuant to a municipal consent and franchise, and an Order of the Board approving the franchise and accepting Petitioner's initial tariff for filing.
- 4. Petitioner also purchases wastewater treatment services from the Logan Township Municipal Utilities Authority ("LTMUA"). LTMUA treats all of the wastewater collected by the Company in its Woolwich service territory pursuant to the Sewer Service Agreement dated September 14, 2000 (as amended April 28, 2015) between the Company and LTMUA. LTMUA bills the Company a fixed monthly amount for each Equivalent Dwelling Unit ("EDU"), which is determined by the LTMUA rate schedule in effect. There are approximately 2,959 EDUs for which the LTMUA provides treatment.
- 5. Prior to January 1, 2021, the Company's rate schedules included a separate PSTAC for Wallkill³ and Maxim⁴ customers, and the treatment costs for LTMUA were included in the fixed monthly service charge to customers serviced by the Woolwich, California Village, Hanover Village and Spartan Village systems. In connection with the Company's 2020 Wastewater Base

Rate Case, BPU Docket No. WR20010056, the Board approved the Company's request to establish a uniform PSTAC to include all of its purchased water treatment costs and to charge those costs to all customers.⁵ Accordingly, effective January 1, 2021, Petitioner established a uniform purchased wastewater treatment adjustment clause ("PSTAC") for all customers, which rates are set forth in its currently effective tariff at Rate Schedule No. 2.

- 6. On August 10, 2021, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to 7.7, Aqua filed the above-captioned Petition with the Board, which was later assigned BPU Docket No. WR21081056, to set prospective rates for calendar year 2022 as required by N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d)(2) and 14:9-7.7.6 Aqua will true-up 2021 PSTAC revenues and rates in its 2022 PSTAC filing, and commits that it will make this filing on a timely basis.
- 7. The matter was retained by the Board for review and disposition. The Parties agreed that a public comment hearing was not required because the Petitioner had proposed a decrease in rates.
- 8. Petitioner's rates reflect the recovery of wastewater treatment charges imposed by the SCMUA, the OCUA, and the LTMUA. The current PSTAC tariff was approved by the Board in the Wastewater BRC Order in Docket No. WR20010056, which established the uniform PSTAC rate for calendar year 2021 and confirmed the PSTAC rates (without true-up) for 2019 and 2020.

⁶ The Company did not request approval of a true-up of PSTAC costs and revenues for calendar years 2019 and 2020, because in connection with the transition from a separate PSTAC to a uniform PSTAC in the 2020 Wastewater Base Rate Case, the parties thereto agreed that there would be no true-up of costs and revenues with estimated costs and revenues for Wallkill and Maxim for 2019 and 2020, which agreement was approved by the Board in the Wastewater BRC Order. *See* Wastewater BRC Order, at 5-6 (citing to Exhibit A, Stipulation of Settlement, at ¶ 8, n.2).

- 9. In this proceeding, the Parties have examined the Company's projected wastewater treatment expenses for 2022, as well as the costs of this proceeding. Based on the foregoing, the Parties have determined that the current PSTAC rate should remain the same for 2022. In its Petition, the Company determined that current PSTAC rate should be decreased to recover \$28,697 less in revenues. The \$28,697 PSTAC decrease was calculated based on the following components:
 - a) projected SCMUA charges for 2022 of \$144,891 based on SCMUA rates effective for 2021 (See Exhibit A, page 1);
 - b) projected OCUA charges for 2022 of \$949,165 based on OCUA rates effective for 2021 (See Exhibit A, page 1);
 - c) projected LTMUA charges for 2022 of \$1,154,544 based on LTMUA rates effective for 2021 (See Exhibit A, page 1);
 - d) the total costs of this proceeding are deemed to be \$6,250 (See Exhibit A, page 2). These costs will be shared 50/50 between ratepayers and shareholders, resulting in a cost to customers of \$3,125 (See Exhibit A, page 4); and
 - e) the pro forma PSTAC revenues at present rates are projected to be \$2,280,422 (See Exhibit A, page 4).
- 10. However, after the Petition was filed and during the discovery period, Aqua received a notice from SCUMA indicating that the treatment rate would be increased from \$144,891 to \$166,531 for 2022. With this increase to expense, the previously calculated decrease went from \$28,697 to \$7,057. Consequently, the proposed rate decrease went from -1.26% to -0.31%. See Exhibit B (revised PSTAC schedules reflecting SCUMA rate increase, pages 1, 4 and

- 5). In addition, the Parties believe it reasonably likely that OCUA may also increase the Company's treatment costs for 2022, which increase will not be captured in rates for 2022.
- 11. As required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.7, the Company has included in its filing an estimate of treatment costs for calendar year 2022, which estimate has been used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2022.
- 12. Based on the estimated costs for 2022 and the costs of this proceeding, the Parties have agreed that Petitioner's current PSTAC rates on file with the Board should remain the same.
- Company will file with the Board a PSTAC petition to reconcile calendar year 2021 actual treatment costs with the estimated treatment costs (as reflected in the rates identified on Exhibit A) for the same period. Additionally, the Company will include in its filing an estimate of treatment costs for calendar year 2023, which estimate will be used to determine the applicable PSTAC rate for 2023, as required in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d) and 14:9-7.7.
- 14. The Parties have engaged in full discovery. The Parties agree that the within Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions, and that it is being entered into in the spirit of compromise and to avoid protracted and costly litigation.
- 15. This Stipulation is the product of negotiations by the Parties, and it is an express condition of the settlement embodied by this Stipulation that it be presented to the Board in its entirety without modification or condition. It is also the intent of the Parties to this Stipulation that this settlement, once accepted and approved by the Board, shall govern all issues specified and agreed to herein. The Parties to this Stipulation specifically agree that if adopted in its entirety by the Board, no appeal shall be taken by them from the order adopting same as to those issues upon which the Parties have stipulated herein.

- 16. The Parties agree that each term within this Stipulation reflects a mutual balancing of various issues and positions and is intended to be accepted and approved in its entirety. Each term is vital to this Stipulation as a whole, since the Parties hereto expressly and jointly state that they would not have signed this Stipulation had any terms been modified in any way. In the event any particular aspect of this Stipulation is not accepted and approved by the Board, then any Party hereto materially affected thereby shall not be bound to proceed under this Stipulation.
- 17. The Parties further agree that with respect to any policy or other issues which were compromised in the spirit of reaching an agreement, none of the Parties shall be prohibited from, or prejudiced in, arguing a different policy or position before the Board in any other proceeding, as such agreements pertain only to this matter and to no other matter. It is specifically understood and agreed that this Stipulation represents a negotiated agreement and has been made exclusively for the purpose of this proceeding. Except as expressly provided herein, the Parties shall not be deemed to have approved, agreed to, or consented to any principle or methodology underlying or supposedly underlying any agreement provided herein in total or by specific item. The Parties further agree that this Stipulation is in no way binding upon them in any other proceeding, except to enforce the terms of this Stipulation.

18. This Stipulation may be executed in as many counterparts as there are Parties to this Stipulation, each of which counterparts shall be an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.





Dear Secretary Camacho-Welch:

On behalf of Aqua New Jersey, Inc. ("Aqua") please accept this letter as a formal request for permission to defer Aqua's annual PSTAC filing, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to 7.7, until 2023. Specifically, Aqua is requesting that the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities ("Board"): (1) approve the continuation of the PSTAC rates set forth in Aqua's Wastewater Tariff, Rate Schedule No. 2, until a new rate is approved in Aqua's next PSTAC filing (which will be filed in 2023); (2) to agree to waive, to the extent necessary, the requirement in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1(d)(2), that Aqua file a petition for an adjusted PSTAC for the upcoming year; and (3) to allow Aqua to defer the true-up of 2021 PSTAC costs to its 2023 PSTAC filing.

¹ A copy of Rate Schedule No. 2 is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit A</u>. As noted in the Board's Order approving the Stipulation of Settlement in *I/M/O the Petition of Aqua New Jersey, Inc. For Approval Of A 2022 Purchased Water Treatment Adjustment Clause Rate and Other Required Approvals*, BPU Dkt. No. WR21081067, at 3, the PSTAC rate effective January 1, 2021 was to remain in effect for 2022.

² Aqua believes it would be entirely appropriate for the Board to treat this letter as an informal petition that satisfies the requirement of the regulation.

Based on Aqua's calculations, when taking into consideration the true-up of PSTAC costs for the year ended December 31, 2021 and the proposed costs for the year ending December 31, 2022, the anticipated increase in revenues needed to cover 2023 PSTAC costs is \$33,134.³ This equates to an approximately \$0.34 increase in the monthly PSTAC rate for residential customers (or an increase from \$25.21 to \$25.57 per month).⁴

Following discussions with the Division of Rate Counsel and Board Staff, both Staff and Rate Counsel concur with and support Aqua's request to keep the PSTAC rates currently in place for 2023 and to defer the true-up of the 2021 PSTAC costs to the 2023 filing, which filing would then true-up costs from 2021 and 2022. The deferral of the true-up until Aqua's next PSTAC filing is in the best interests of all parties as it reduces expenses/customer costs and preserves administrative resources.

Accordingly, Aqua, with the consent of Rate Counsel and Staff, respectfully requests that the Board:

- 1. Approve the continuation of the currently effective PSTAC rates, as approved by the Board in its Order in BPU Dkt. No. WR21081067, and as set forth in Rate Schedule No. 2 of Aqua's B.P.U. NO. 18 SEWER Tariff (see Exhibit A);
- 2. Permit Aqua to defer its true-up of 2021 PSTAC costs to its 2023 PSTAC filing, which filing will true-up 2021 and 2022 PSTAC costs and seek to establish a new PSTAC rate to be effective January 1, 2024; and
- 3. Agree to waive any filing requirements in N.J.A.C. 14:9-7.1 to 7.7, to the extent necessary, related to the true-up of PSTAC costs for 2021 and to establishing a new rate for 2023; and
- 4. Such other an further relief as the Board deems necessary and proper.







SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

No additional charge shall be established for recirculating water or air-cooled air conditioning units.

Rates apply to normal sewerage as defined by the NJDEP and the Ocean County Utilities Authority ("OCUA"). Aqua reserves the right to require pretreatment prior to discharge into the sewer system if the sewerage contains harmful substances such as gasoline, P.C.B.s, oil, explosive liquids, grease, phenols, acids, alkelines, lint, excessive detergents or any other toxic or hazardous substances as defined by NJDEP and/or OCUA. This paragraph includes but is not limited to laundromats or dry cleaners where the owner will be required to provide a screen or filter to remove excessive lint before discharge into the sewer system.


